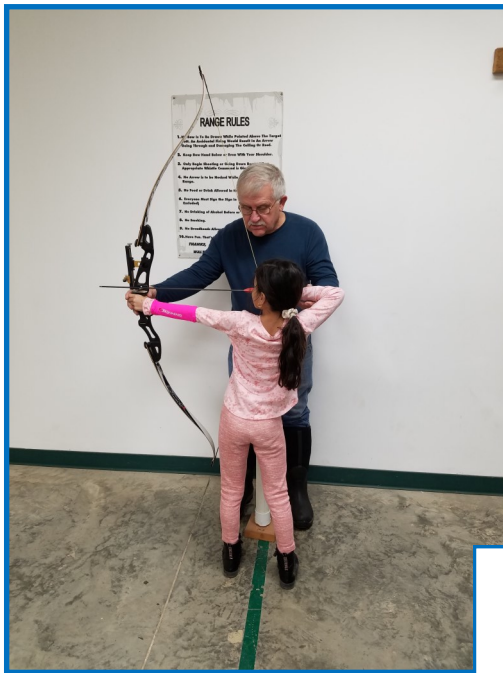


Wapsi Warriors JOAD

Logging Update

The logging on the grounds is finished. We are preparing to enter the next phase. The board is discussing preliminary plans and we will have meetings of the conservation committee during February to start thinking about the next steps toward opening courses and rehabilitating the grounds. This is a long term project that will take several years. There are large skidder roads which have been bulldozed. These are quite compacted and will take some work to rehabilitate but may provide a basis for trails and shooting lanes. The immediate next step is to continue with debris management and disposal.



Scott Mason spent some time working for the US Forest Services and has been working with us, showing us how to burn brush piles in the woods. We have started and will be continuing to do some of this through the winter. Please contact Carl Mally or Larry Isaacs if you wish to help. Carl will be working with people during the weekdays and Larry and Scott will be working on some of the weekends. Some of these piles will be burning for a lengthy period so do not be surprised if you see smoke. If it does appear to be out of control or a serious problem contact us. The woods are now walkable, except the pines though the pines road is open. Please take the time to walk some of it this winter and spring. It will give you a better picture of what yet needs to be done as well as good exercise in the outdoors.
