Membership with Benefits

We get asked all the time how much are membership dues and what are my benefits?

As a board we have kind of come to the conclusion that there are 2 aspects to this club, Why be a Member and why would some one shoot our shoots or leagues?

But we also noted that a third aspect is, there's a lot of work to be done to keep up the club grounds and facilities and functions running.

So we think we may have come up with a solution to enhance member benefits, thus increasing the membership size and rewarding those who put in volunteer time at the club to ensure the work gets done.

First, let me say that this is the first draft. You gotta start somewhere. Might as well be here.

Right off the bat I'm gonna sock ya! Raise dues to \$75. Got your attention now !?
Dues haven't been raised since the mid nineties and with the cost of living everything costs more to operate.

However, there are member benefits that come with that \$25 increase.

First, members would get 10 punches on their membership card to use for \$2 off a shoot or whatever they like.

Secondly, we would drop the indoor open shoot fee to \$3 for members vs. \$6 for non-members.

We shouldn't lose any money doing this because the number of members should go up, bringing in more revenue early on in the year for the club.

Next is volunteer incentive. A lot of work is needed to keep this club in running order and those who put in the work should be recognized for that.

So we are proposing that if a member puts in X amount of hours of work in the previous year, they would get a \$25 discount on dues and some type of apparel that you could only get by putting in so many hours of work.

That work would include Shoot set up, Registration, Kitchen help, Grounds work, Special Projects, League managers etc.

We will have a more detailed proposal at the next membership meeting. This will take a change of the by-laws and a vote by the membership to pass. So watch for more details.
