

Traditional Shoot

This weekend Aug 6th & 7th is the Waltonian Archers traditional shoot.

Animals will be set out this Thursday afternoon starting at 4 PM.

Anyone interested in helping set out animals or work the shoot, contact Rick Rogers (319-373-5867), Dave Mason (319-435-2612) or Cal Struchen (319-393-2448).

Notes from our Conversation with Linn County Forester – Mark Vitosh:

- There has been a forester working with the club at one time or another since 1960.
- Mark has been reviewing the grounds from a conservation perspective not a monetary perspective.
- During the last cutting more than 50 trees that were not marked were taken out.
- Mark thinks the Oak Wilt has been taken care of in areas were it was seen.
- The new trees are coming along nicely.
- Mark has revised the stewardship he originally wrote (contact Cal Struchen if you are interested in reviewing this information)
- Over the next couple of years it will begin to be hard to move through those areas where the cuttings occurred.
- Mark has reviewed the wind damage site and marked 28 trees to be removed. (the logger had marked almost 60)
- Mark recommends cutting a minimum number of trees. He feels there are a good number that may survive.
- Garlic Mustard and Honey Suckle are on the grounds and should be pushed back. These are aggressive vegetation and if not controlled will take over the forest floor.
- For Honey Suckle it's best to pull it on a wet spring day and leave it where it lay.
- For Garlic Mustard there are a couple of things to do.
 - -Pull it and burn the plant so the seeds do not spread.
 - -In the fall hit it with round up, in the spring weed whack it to the ground and hit the remains with roundup.
- Round up helps to keep Poison Ivy back but it is very difficult to totally get rid of.
- Pines trees would be hard to salvage or get any benefit back to the existing trees and much work would be needed.
- Sugar Maple (smooth bark saplings) should be cut out of the white range or it will eventually degrade the white oaks. For these it is best to cut them at ground level and treat the stumps with a bit of round up applied with a paint brush.
- We may want to look at a burn in a few spots to keep some of the unwanted vegetation back. Linn County Conservation has a burn school that someone would need to attend before we could consider this option.
- Osage Orange is not a native tree to this area. It is native to south Texas and Mark suggests we not plant it. It is an aggressive tree and there is not much you can do to keep it from taking over.

Conservation:

There are still a large number of sapling maple trees through out the club grounds that the forester would like to see us take down so that the hardwood saplings can get more sun. Anyone looking for something to do can walk the grounds and cut down any smooth bar saplings you find. The forester would like us to just leave the saplings where they are when cut.

Firewood:

There are still quit a few downed trees on the club grounds that need to be cleaned up. If you would like to take some time and cut firewood it would be greatly appreciated. Wood is being stacked at the bottom of the pines. As a fund raiser the club will be selling a truck load of fire wood for \$65.00. If you know of someone interested in purchasing firewood, contact a club officer. Phone numbers for all club officers are listed at the beginning of The Shavings.

Safety Note:

Due to safety concerns the big tree stand at the top of the hill is closed until repairs are made.

To-Do List:

The following is a list of a few of the items that need to be worked on out at the club:

- Cut down any small smooth barked saplings, 6 inches or less thick. These are the small maples that the
 conservation officer has told us should be cut down to prevent eventual shading out of the oaks and other
 hardwoods. The White and Orange ranges are the main areas to concentrate on for now.
- Course maintenance will need to be started. Walk the courses and see if there are any targets that need to be raked and mowed.
- Cleaning up wood piles. Any wood that can be used as fire wood should be stacked at the bottom of the pines.
 Wood piles to the right of the road are for trees that have been downed for a time.
 Wood piles to the left of the road are from trees recently cut.

Be sure to check the board in the outdoor pavilion area for a complete list of items that need to be completed.
