



Note from the President:

The Waltonian Archers were host to the three Bow Hunter Education classes held the last week of September and first week of October to certify bow hunters for the new Cedar Rapids/Coralville Inner-city bow hunts. Thanks go to Dave Nichols (Deer Task Force Administrator), Steve Havlik (Cedar Rapids Fire Chief) and the many people involved to make this hunt finally happen.

Thanks also go to Dave Mason, Kelly O'Mera, and Art Foster for teaching the Bow Hunter Education classes and Great Outdoor Traditions for their help with advertising and donations. In all there were approximately 120 bow hunters certified through the classes.

The Building committee met at the club grounds on 10/17 2005. After much discussion, a recommendation was decided upon and presented at the 10/19 2005 club meeting. The board's recommendation included a couple of points: 1) When pouring cement for the floor, include the tubing needed for in floor heat. This would provide us with the option of in floor heat in the future.

2) Proceed with the option of a Forced Air Heat Furnace which could be made to include A/C at a future date.

A motion was made to accept the Building Committee's recommendations with the condition that we would not proceed until we have the money in the building fund to complete the project. The motion was passed.

I was admittedly disappointed at the out come as I was hoping to get the building far enough along to be able to shoot winter leagues at the club grounds. But, we need move on and raise the money to complete what we have started. We are going to form a Fund Raising committee for the building fund. We need help with this project. Myself or the Board of Directors can not do it all by ourselves. We need all of the membership to take an active part if we are going to get this project completed.

Call me (393-2448) and give me your ideas, support, donations or names of organizations, foundations or people who might be able to help us reach our goal.

In the meantime, we are looking to hold winter leagues at the Round House (we'll find out for sure in Nov.)

Our next club meeting will be held in the conference room at Great Outdoor Traditions (formerly Fin & Feather) in Cedar Rapids on 11/16 2005.

Fund Raising Committee:

In an effort to help raise funds for the new building a Fund Raising Committee is being formed. Anyone interested in joining the fund raising committee should contact Cal Struchen. Your help and support in this fund raising venture is greatly needed. It is going to take the help of all club members to make the completion of the new building a reality.

Scouts and the Club Grounds:

At the October club meeting we were once again visited by the Boy Scouts of America. The club has decided to move forward with the idea of creating a Venture Crew that would focus on archery and promote scouting values. The club grounds will be used as the group's main meeting area. The Venture Crew will be a Co-Ed Venture Crew for young people ages 14-20. 5 young people and 5 adults (one female) are needed to get this Venture Crew started. As part of the Boy Scouts of America the Venture Crew will be covered under the Boy Scouts insurance when participating in Scout sponsored events such as meetings, shoots or community service days out at the club. The cost to charter the crew is \$25.00 a year. Each member of the crew will pay a yearly registration fee of \$10.00 and about \$2.50 a year to be covered under the Scouting insurance policy. Although focused on archery, members of the Venture Crew are able to earn multiple awards for participation in activities other than archery. This gives members the opportunity to experience, learn and grow in other areas. The crew is organized by the members with adult guidance. This structure gives members a greater sense of ownership and helps to promote organizational values.
