Scouts and the Club Grounds:

The Boy Scouts of America, Hawkeye Area Council would like to work with the club to start an outdoor oriented Venture Crew that would focus on archery and promote scouting values. The club grounds would be used as the group's main meeting area. The Venture Crew would be a Co-Ed Venture Crew for young people ages 14-20. 5 young people and 5 adults (one female) are needed to get the Venture Crew off the ground. As part of the Boy Scouts of America the Venture Crew would be covered under the Boy Scouts insurance when participating in Scout sponsored events such as meetings, shoots or community service days out at the club. The cost to charter the crew is \$25.00 a year. Each member of the crew will pay a yearly registration fee of \$10.00 and about \$2.50 a year to be covered under the Scouting insurance policy. Although focused on archery, members of the Venture Crew are able to earn multiple awards for participation in activities other than archery. This gives members the opportunity to experience, learn and grow in other areas. The crew is organized by the members with adult guidance. This structure gives members a greater sense of ownership and helps to promote organizational values. Iowa Youth Hunter Education Challenge:

At the September club meeting Tom Blythe from the North Linn Fish and Game presented the Iowa Youth Hunter Education Challenge. It is a Co-Ed competition for young people ages 12-18. As a participant in the competition, young people learn to be responsible with firearms and ethical in their use of the natural resources of our country. Throughout the year, participants practice in the 8 specific categories that make up the competition. Four marksmanship categories: Archery, Shotgun shooting, Rifle shooting and Muzzle loaded rifles and four practical or knowledge based categories: Wildlife Identification, Orienteering, the Hunters Safety Trail and a general knowledge written exam.
