

Alburnett Archery Teams make a good showing at NASP Nationals

On May 11th and 12th a World record was set at the National Tournament for the National Archery in the Schools Program (NASP) in Louisville KY when 7,804 archers participated in the largest archery tournament in the world. Iowa was represented by 9 schools and 14 teams. Alburnett had the top Iowa score for High school teams with their score of 3272 which placed them 34th out of 126. The Alburnett team had several members shoot their personal best including Richard Magoon who shot 285, Eon Struchen with a 271, Kailey Walker with a 236 and Nate Graham with his 221. Other members of the team include Elementary students Zindrick Burns, Matthew Barnett, Morgan Martin and Cam Miene: Middle school archers Brianna Murdock, Austin Heft and Kayla MacDonald: and High School archers Zack Bisinger, Adri Miene, Christian Magoon, Andrew Barnett, Tymbrie Snobl, Michelle Aller, Sebastian Struchen and Josh Walker. All the archers shot well with most of them scoring at or above their averages.

For the third year in a row Alburnett had a team member reach the podium. This year it was 10th grader Tymbrie Snobl who shot an impressive 292 which placed her in second for High School girls. Tymbrie tied for 4th overall for girls and participated in a shoot off to determine who would shoot for the four scholarships available. After her first 5 arrows she was tied and they went to a one arrow shoot off which Tymbrie won. In the scholarship shoot off she scored a perfect 50 to win the top scholarship of \$10,000 with all the lowans present cheering her on. She was also named to the Army National Guard All-American team which takes the top 16 scores of the tournament including at least 5 opposite gender and makes them a team. The hypothetical team score would have been 3551 had these archers been counted together as a team. (Perfect would be 3600). The coaching staff and whole team want to congratulate Tymbrie on a job well done! We are very proud!
