Well, I think I have rambled enough for now. Have a great March and Shoot 'em straight!



Logging/Range Cleanup Update

We have made significant progress in opening up ranges. We have located all of the existing shooting butts on the white range and cleared them enough to have a clear shot for a 3D shoot and paths to and from them. There are two butts that are fallen and one needs further straightening. Targets 2, 3 and 4 will need further lane clearing to have enough distance for all of the markers for a field shoot. They can be used as is for 3D shoots. All of the other targets have the lanes fully clear.

The shooting spots and targets on the lower part of the blue range are substantially clear enough to make shots. Some debris has appeared in the walking paths after the snow melted and will need to be picked up. We have paths opened in and out of the upper portion of the blue range around the shooting stand. That area had major damage and will require some further clean up to be usable. Eventually it will have to be re-laid out.

Thank you to Bob Schell, Ty Krumm, Dennis Ringgenberg, Don Parker and Tom Wright for their help in this. We have been working about once a week through most of the winter on this..

The DNR District Forester, Mark Vitosh, called me last week. He has walked the range and inspected it for the EFRP program. He said that the loggers did a very good job in the salvage harvest and that is is much better than he has seen from most companies. It meets the standards for the EFRP program. We discussed some of his recommendations for brush handling, erosion control and replanting. He is willing to meet with us and walk the ranges to discuss his recommendations for next steps. This will be set up for later this month. People on the conservation committee or other club members are welcome to attend but it will be on a weekday morning.
