Conservation and Forestry

I would like to tell everyone that this time of year is a great time to be out in the woods at the club. Spring birds are migrating through and animals are waking up and moving. In the last few weeks I have seen a turkey near the machine shed, eagles circle overhead for extended periods, bluebirds on the old swing set and what I first thought was a grouse but turned out to be a woodcock.

We are preparing to plant another set of trees on the weekend of April 13th and 14th. We are clearing an area on the upper blue range around the Boy Scout shooting stand. The planting will be similar to what was done on the orange range last year. We have ordered 150 seedlings from the DNR Nursery, including red oak, white oak, black walnut and northern pecan. The pecans would be new to the club. They are related to hickory and grow in Iowa as far north as Kossuth County near Algona.

The area we are planting had extensive damage but we have largely cleared it with only a bit more to do. We will also tentatively have loggers return in the first week of April to remove more dead oaks. The oaks have been dying off, apparently due to stress, drought and insects in something called Sudden White Oak Death Syndrome. Foresters and DNR biologists have observed and studied it in five states since 2015 but have not been able to isolate a single cause.

We really do not wish to lose more trees but at least can start replacing some of what is lost. We planted 100 on the Orange range last year as well as seeding an area on the white range with walnuts, acorns and hickory nuts. You may have noticed pink ribbons on a number of small seedlings near the clubhouse. These are oaks, walnut and hickory which have grown naturally. I am going to attempt to transplant a number of these to spread them out since they are growing so closely. There are several other areas where oak, hickory and walnuts are regenerating naturally. I have cleared maple and other faster growing species around these to prevent them from being shaded out. With the 150 new seedlings to be planted this will give us a good start on regrowing woodlands.
