Derecho Clean-Up Update

October

Bill Miller from Miller and Sons Logging company contacted me last week. We are still on for mid October. There is not an exact date yet. Dennis Ringgenberg and myself will act as contact people with the logging company. If you have questions or concerns about the work they are doing please run them through myself or Dennis so we do not have a 20 people trying to be boss over the loggers. The loggers will be instructed that if other people come around with advice or instructions or directions or ideas about what they should be doing that they should direct them back to Dennis or myself. We are going to give them access to the clubhouse for restrooms and kitchen use so it is ok if they are inside. I will update you all again once a firm date is set.

We have enrolled in the USDA Emergency Forest Restoration Program. It may provide matching payments if we spend money in excess of that received from logging. Part of the match is against our work hours for light debris removal. It will pay 75 percent of \$112.50 per hour up to \$8400. This would apply to work on the orange, white, blue or red ranges only and between November 1 and March 15th. The program goes for one year from August 29th with the possibility of extending it for a second year. There is also provision for matching funds for heavy clean up if we have to hire people to do things that the loggers do not cover. I will have a log book for hours in the clubhouse once we start doing any of that kind of work. It may not provide any payout due to the limitations of the program but is there if work goes beyond what the loggers payment covers.

We have done a lot of clean up of brush piles around the clubhouse area and gate. The areas around the clubhouse and flats are nearly complete. We have burned twice this summer and again in late September. (Pictures are from September 30th) Any time we burn we have to call the number for the Sheriff's Office listed on the burn permit posted in the clubhouse and make sure conditions are ok to do so on that day. We also make sure water is available and have enough people watching to prevent it from spreading.


