Waltonian Archers of Linn County, est April 1935

The club was formed in April of this year led by Fred Enders. The charter members were Warren Hartman, Fred Enders, John Kohls, and Don Seegers and with the help of the local Isaac Walton league (only the name is retained although there is no connection with them). Some of the other members were W H Linders, Jack Dysart, Russ Graham, Paul Samos, Charles Murray, Miles Fisher, Peck Hogland, Don Meyers, and Mary Newland. There were twenty-three members in the club, seven of which were women. There were no permanent records kept the first few years and the by-laws were lost and were rewritten. The meetings were held twice a month in the member's homes. Club officers were elected in December of this year. There was \$6.31 in the club treasury. (Waltonians Archers history from our website)

Aa our history says, records were lost and rewritten, but I spent some time in the Cedar Rapids Gazette archive, through the Cedar Rapids Public Library—here's what I found...

Archery Shoots To Be Held Each Sunday At Ellis

Favorable shooting weather has it swelled the membership of the call waltopian archers. Starting Sunday, regular shoots will be held each Sanday at 2 am, and at 2 p.m. Official American rounds consisting of thirty arrows at sixty yards, thirty at fifty, and thirty ar furty will be shot by the men. The Columbia round of fifty, forty and thirty yards with be shot by the ladies. Practice shoots will be held Tuesday and Thursday evenings. All shooting will be done at the archery range in Ellis park.

Starting June 1, high scores of the local club will be sent to the Nullimal Archery association each nionth in competition with affiliated clubs throughout the country.

Archery is expected to prove an ideal recreation for those who do not care for the more strenuous sports; as the development of steady norve, perfect form and good judgment are more important than strength; and the satisfaction of having an arrow fly straight to the goal at fifty or staty yards will thrill archer and speciator alike.

There are a number of articles in the archive, enough to show the newly formed Waltonians were very active, creating one of the best ranges in the state at Ellis Park. Sorry for the variation in print quality, they are easier to read on the library archive site.
